
RE : Mr. Clifton Guillory

In reviewing the incident involving Mr. Clifton Guillory on September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2010 at 3:00 a.m., I have no information showing that Mr. Guillory's release by a Jefferson County Sheriff Deputy to a BISD police officer was improper or that the officer had requested Mr. Guillory's release.

There has not been any information presented to show that Mr. Guillory violated any laws. (See attached reports)

September 10, 2010

On Saturday September 4, 2010 at approximately 0300 hours, I Officer D. Janise was contacted by phone by a BISD dispatcher to assist officers at the intersection of Calder and Phelan. The dispatcher did not notify me of the situation. Upon my arrival I observed three Sheriff Department patrol units in the parking lot of Munro's Cleaners. The Sheriff Deputy that conducted the traffic stop was on the phone with his supervisor. When he ended his phone call he told me that Mr. Guillory had failed to maintain a single lane and he appeared to be intoxicated. I asked the deputy, "How can I assist you?" and he asked me what I wanted to do. I told him, "This is your traffic stop and I'm not here to tell you what to do." The Deputy told me that he would let Mr. Guillory go but I would have to secure the vehicle and transport him home. I did not observe any test being conducted and I was not present during the interview. Before I agreed to the Deputy's terms I received a cellular call from Sergeant Hall. Hall asked me what the deputy was going to do with Mr. Guillory, I told him that the Sheriff was releasing Mr. Guillory but I had to secure the vehicle and transport him home. Hall told me to tell the deputy thank you and for me to transport Mr. Guillory home. The deputy then had Mr. Guillory to get out of the vehicle; I parked the truck in an empty parking spot on Munro's parking lot. While I was in the vehicle I did not observe any containers with alcohol. The vehicle did not smell of alcohol. I did not observe Mr. Guillory having a problem walking or standing. While I was transporting Mr. Guillory home he told me that he called Sergeant Hall from his cell phone and told him he was being pulled over by the police. I could not smell alcohol on Mr. Guillory's breath. I transported Mr. Guillory to his residence located at Daisy in Beaumont, Texas. No further actions were taken on my part.

To Whom It May Concern;

On Sept. 3 2010 approximately 3:00 am I received a phone call from Mr. Guillory, the Transportation Director. Mr. Guillory stated that he had been stopped by the Police (Sheriff Dept.) who told him that they had stopped him because they saw him weaving. I asked Mr. Guillory if he was tired and like me to have a unit come and drive him home. Mr. Guillory stated yes he would because he didn't want to take a chance of driving his company truck. I asked Mr. Guillory if the police had him do any type of test or asked him if he had anything to drink and Mr. Guillory stated that the police never asked him anything about drinking or to perform any type of test. I spoke with the police officer and he never mentioned anything about alcohol being a factor of Mr. Guillory's traffic stop. I then had the dispatcher to have Officer Janice to go by and take Mr. Guillory home.
